Position: Associate Director - Children's Worship Arts

General Description

The Children's Worship Arts Director is primarily responsible for planning and executing a comprehensive children's worship arts ministry that enhances the worships of Faith Lutheran Church, educates young disciples, and serves the needs of the overall ministry, mission, and values of FLC. This position has three main area of focus: children's worship, children's worship arts, and children's music instruction.

This position directly reports to and supports the Minister of Worship Arts as part of the total Worship Ministry of the church and also coordinates with the Faith Lutheran Day School Director, other Worship Ministry leaders, and FLC staff. It is the responsibility of the Associate Director – Children's Worship Arts to ensure that all children's worships, arts, and education have the highest possible artistic quality and leadership, both current and theologically sound.

• Experience and/or ability to plan and produce Christ-centered, engaging, age-appropriate, and current children's worship, arts, and education experiences

• Experience and training as children's worship leader and teacher, with performance skill in one or more instruments including voice

- Experience and/or training as a children's worship team leader, from the multi-arts perspective
- Ability to recruit, build, and train a team of ministry disciples
- Ability to select materials and music appropriate to the worship style, classroom age, team make-up, and theology of the church
- Ability to stay current regarding evolving children's worship and education materials and music

Essential Functions:

Children's Worship Leader

• Plan/produce God-honoring, excellent children's worship experiences, scheduled as fits the church's needs based on the overall worship plans and working in partnership with other primary leaders including Lead Pastor, Minister of Worship Arts, Director of Faith Formation, etc.

• Under the direction of the Lead Pastor and the Minister of Worship Arts, continually assess children's worship

experiences for the following: 1) soundness of theology, 2) adherence to FLC mission and vision, 3) adherence to FLC plan for children's worship, and 4) budgetary needs.

• Lead the children's worship team and its disciples as follows: supervise, delegate, recruit, train, schedule, evaluate, grow skills, nurture relationships, etc.

• Build the children's worship ministry, seeking opportunities to equip, encourage, and empower disciples of many ages for leadership and service.

- Build the children's worship team for depth; position team for multiple weekend worships.
- Maintain a process that continually selects new worshipper age-appropriate and leadership team-appropriate worship materials, songs, etc. and retires/revamps less effective materials.
- Provide resources (materials, music, etc.) for worship team; maintain appropriate library of these resources onsite.

Children's Worship Arts Director

• Plan, build, and direct a varied children's worship arts program, including such offerings as children's (and youth) choir/s, dance, drama, etc.

• Continually assess each children's worship arts experience to ensure it: 1) nurtures relationships with Jesus, 2) builds skills in the specific art/s, and 3) adheres to FLC mission and vision

- Direct the children's (and youth) choir/s, as well as other offerings as gifted
- Recruit and supervise additional disciple leaders in children's worship arts
- Under the direction of the Minister of Worship Arts, regularly schedule children's worship arts in the weekly worship services as well as in other special worship events

• Under the direction of the Minister of Worship Arts, plan specific children's worship arts offerings that are thematic and event-appropriate

Children's Music Teacher – Faith Lutheran Day School

• Coordinating with the Faith Lutheran Day School Director, teach music classes for ages 2 through kindergarten on a weekly basis to fit within the school schedule

- Coordinate Christmas programs for all ages
- Coordinate graduation programs for Pre-K/Jr K/K
- Work cooperatively with the FLDS Director and teaching staff on other special programs or needs requiring fine arts input and/or direction
- Coordinate chapel instruction and music twice per week (currently scheduled on Tuesday and Wednesday at 9:30 am)

Overall/Other

• Attend FLC staff meetings, worship ministry meetings, training events, and retreats as scheduled and required

• Work with Minister of Worship Arts in completing other duties as assigned to maintain a comprehensive worship ministry. In the absence of the Minister of Worship Arts, oversee the ministry area as requested.

- 2. The teacher possesses the educational qualifications and professional commitment necessary to promote children's learning and development and to support families' diverse needs and interests.

- 9. The teacher continually evaluates his/her planning, implementation and daily actions as they affect children, parents and others in the center.

Goals and Objective for FLDS Music Program

- 1. Instill a love of a wide variety of musical styles and genres
- 2. Learn about composers and their works
- 3. Explore 'families' of instruments
- 4. Enhance children's rhythmic speech and expressive speech
- 5. Improve gross and fine motor movements
- 6. Work together in ensemble settings, appreciating the value of each fellow student
- 7. Share instrument and increase patience with others
- 8. Instill a sense of compassion for others and their abilities

- 9. Learn basic rhythmic structures—with younger children, use familiar words for patterns, such a "cat" for quarter note, "turtle" for eight notes, "elephant" for eighth, eighth, quarter; for kindergarten students, use "ta," "ti-ti," etc.
- 10. Explore high versus low pitches
- 11. Improve vocal pitch matching
- 12. Learn care of instruments, such as gentle playing even when music is fast
- 13. Teach "real" vocabulary words for musical terms, such as tempo and dynamics
- 14. Improve skills for following directions
- 15. Allow for free-play time on instruments to increase enjoyment and enhance self-esteem
- 16. Repeat songs/finger plays/concepts enough that all children understand, but provide a wide variety of activities to ensure constant interest and excitement for coming to music class
- 17. Cross-over chapel concepts and stories into music class
